# RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE SOCIETY

1. All Exhibits: Entries received Thursday, September 7, 2023, 6:00 pm - 8:30 pm, or Friday, September 8, 2023, 8:00 am -12:00 noon. Note: Friday Junior times (#2). All Adult Division exhibitors must leave the Arena by 12:00 noon Friday, September 8th. Judging starts at 12:00 noon Friday.
2. Junior entries must be in by 9:30 am Friday, September 8th. Judging begins promptly at 10:00 am for junior exhibits. All exhibitors must leave by 9:30 am to allow time for sorting. PLEASE NOTE: The Junior Book is distributed separately and can also be found at warkworthfair.com.
3. All members may exhibit for free. Any exhibitor must be a member of the P.A.S. To become a member of the P.A.S. a membership fee of \$10.00 must be paid. Each paid member will receive a one-day admission pass to the fair.
4. One entry per person per section.
5. Entries must be the exhibitor's personal work & not shown in any previous Warkworth Fair.
6. All baking must be displayed on a suitably sized disposable plate, tray or covered cardboard, unless otherwise specified and covered in a clear plastic bag. No plastic wraps. Disposable tray must be new and unused.
7. All pies must be baked in foil pans, no glass, ceramic, or stoneware.
8. Judges may disqualify soiled pans/or old exhibits.
9. Any exhibit, even though it may be the only entry in its section, will be awarded a prize only if it possesses enough merit as determined by the judge.
10. Exhibitors contravening any of the P.A.S. regulations shall forfeit all premiums to which they might otherwise be entitled at this exhibition. All special prizes offered on our Prize List shall be governed by the rules of P.A.S.
11. Exhibits on display until 4 pm Sunday, except for baking and preserves for the bake sale at 3:30 pm
12. Prize money winnings for adult divisions will be available for collection on Sunday at 4:00 pm in arena. Junior division winnings will be available for collection on Saturday and Sunday at the red building.
13. Any person found changing his/her ticket or any other ticket from one article to another shall forfeit all prizes to which he/she might have been entitled. Any item marked unfit to sell, must not be sold on premises.
14. The Treasurer will distribute all prize monies to those whom it may have been awarded, or in equal proportion according to the amount of money in the Treasurer's hand belonging to the Society.
15. All cheques or premiums not cashed before December 31st, of the current year, shall be forfeited to the P.A.S.
16. All protests must be made in writing and submitted, along with a deposit of five dollars, to the P.A.S. Secretary by Saturday at 6:00 pm of the fair weekend. The fee will be returned if the protest is successful. All disputes are to be settled by the Homecraft Directors and the PAS Executive.
17. The Judges must return their books to the Homecraft Director or P.A.S. Secretary before leaving the grounds.



18. All vendors and concessions must carry and show proof of liability insurance. All food vendors must show health inspection and have sticker of inspection from Electrical Authority.
19. All cattle and horses on halter must be securely tied when on the grounds.
20. Every precaution shall be taken for the protection and safety of all visitors to the exhibition and stock and articles on exhibit, but the Society will not be responsible for injury, loss, or damage in any case.
21. P.A.S. will not be held responsible for the sale of any food during the annual Warkworth Fall Fair. All persons purchasing any food products do so at their own risk.
22. Attendees to the Warkworth Fall Fair must adhere to P.A.S. policies regarding Smoking/Vaping and Pets.”
23. Admission fee to the Warkworth Fall Fair: Adults \$10 daily (Friday, Saturday & Sunday entry) or \$25 Weekend pass. Kids grade 8 and under are FREE.
24. All cattle, goat, sheep, and pigs must have an ear identification tag before they are permitted to enter the Warkworth Fairgrounds.

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# NEED-4-SPEED GAMING SHOW

WARKWORTH FALL FAIR, SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 9TH, 2023

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All rules and regulations are governed by the Percy Agricultural Society.
2. The judge's decision is final.
3. Any person under the age of 18 years, must always wear a CSA-approved riding helmet while mounted on the PAS fair grounds (no bicycle or hockey helmets).
4. There will be no refund of arena/timer fees or entry fees.
5. A rider/handler's age is considered as of January 1st of the current year.
6. A horse/rider combination may only enter in one age category.
7. Due to time constraints, please notify the show announcer or ring steward of any tack changes at least 3 classes ahead of time. Rider/handlers must be ready at the gate before their class as they will not be allowed to enter once the class is closed. 3 calls and ride disqualified.
8. Neither the Percy Agricultural Society or the Need-4-Speed Show Committee are responsible for loss, injury or damage to animals, equipment and persons, exhibitors, or spectators.
9. Exhibitors must wear appropriate attire. For Gaming classes this includes a collared, button- down shirt, cowboy hat or helmet, and boots.
10. Any stallion must be shown by a rider/handler 19 years or older.
11. In the Flag class, the flag barrel must remain standing in order for the participant to receive a time. The participant also may not cross the flag over the horse in order to put it in; the flag must be replaced from the opposite side of the barrel from which it was removed.
12. There will be no running starts for Gaming events. Cannot start to run until the horse's body is fully in the chute.
13. Loss of a hat at any time during a gaming run (including before and after the timer) will result in a one (1) second penalty.
14. A fall of the horse or rider during any class will result in disqualification from that event.
15. A knockdown in a games event will result in a five (5) second penalty per barrel or pole.
16. All exhibitors must show proof of insurance.

## **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

- Cattle must be tattooed and have papers unless under 1 year of age.
- A cow/calf pair is “one animal”. If you are going to split the calf that would be considered an additional “animal”.
- Cattle must arrive before 9 am unless communicated prior or be subject to disqualification.
- Exhibitors will be released following the completion of the Open Show Supreme Selections.
- Exhibitors must have proof of liability insurance to show on the grounds.
- Pre- Registration Only.
- Wristbands will be handed out and must be worn.
- There will be no substitutions or additions after the entry deadline.
- Pee Wees and Junior Showmanship contestants must be pre-registered. No Day of entries.
- Junior Show confirmation entry must be registered in Open Show.
- CFIA Tags: Please be aware that all livestock must arrive with CFIA Tags, they are to be tagged before they leave the farm. Should they arrive without tags they are putting themselves at a risk for a fine. Animals will not be allowed entry to the fairgrounds if a tag has been found to be lost, or unattached. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have the tag replaced prior to being allowed entry.

# HORSE PULL 2023

1. All teams are subject to a drug test. Detailed explanation in Rule#18 Section A-J
2. All teamsters / representatives must have proof of current liability insurance for “horse pulling” in the amount of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000)
3. All teamsters / representatives and owners must be a paid up participating member (\$50.00) of OVHDA and in good standing in order to draw in an OVHDA sanctioned pull.
4. There will be no alcoholic beverages used by the teamster / representative, helpers or officials while in the drawing area. If it is deemed that excessive drinking has taken place before or during the horse pull, appropriate action will be taken.
5. All teams must be weighed the day of the draw on association scales if available with halter and loose shank. Absolutely no lifting and teams weigh only twice. If a person argues about the weight of his team, he will have the choice to draw in the heavy class or withdraw his team from the contest. Scales will be open a minimum of 2 ½ hours prior to the scheduled pull time and weighing can begin as soon as the scales are set up. Lightweight teams weigh once per weekend (Thursday – Monday) on OVHDA, CCHPA, EODHA or Northern Draft Horse club scales and your team must enter and pull when weighed at the first pull with the exception if a pull is cancelled due inclement weather, weight slips will be honored. Lightweight class is 3400lb and under with a grace of 25lb and heavyweight class is over 3400lb. A horse or team can only draw in one class and must complete 2 draws to collect hitch money where paid. Distance pullers can rent OVHDA scales and their weigh slips will be accepted by OVHDA if team weighs 3400lb and under.
6. Each teamster must pull to the end with no quitting and will take 1 fair hitch on their last load. If a teamster / representative chooses to quit, it must be declared before they start loading the boat for the next round. If this is not done and he refuses to pull on the last load, he will forfeit and not receive any prize money.
7. A teamster / representative is allowed to enter and drive more than 1 team per class at OVHDA pulls and will draw for their pulling order prior to the beginning of the contest.
8. When a team enters the pulling area with or without blinders, they must stay that way for the duration of the contest. Adjustments to blinders during the pull are not allowed.
9. A) Length of a draw is 15 feet and a total of 5 minutes is allowed to complete 2 draws. The stone boat is to be drawn one way only however, can be drawn both ways for several rounds if deemed safe by the judge and fair board committee. Side lines are

to be 18 ft. apart. If the boat is within 36" from the side lines the next contestant can request to have the boat centered.

- B) When it is a distance pull -- teams will be allowed 2 attempts to pull the boat 15ft in one try. Their second attempt can be taken where the boat is or back to the start line if the boat has already been spotted.

Anything over a 4" chuck in A or B above will be classified as one draw.

10. A teamster / representative is allowed 2 helpers and they must remain behind the leading edge of the whiffletrees while horses are drawing. After completing the first draw there will be no change of teamster / representative except in the case of injury.
11. If there is a break in harness the teamster / representative he has the option to keep that distance or start over. If he chooses to start over, the boat will be placed at the start of the course. Time to repair and break in harness will be determined by the Judge.
12. All teams are to remain stationary in the holding area until winners are determined. It is the responsibility of the teamster / representative to ensure their horses are attended to at all times.
13. A runaway or out of control team: 1st offence – horses will automatically be eliminated from the contest and given a 5 pull suspension followed by 5 pulls with the lines being tailed. 2nd offence – horse(s) will be banned from pulling at OVHDA sanctioned pulls. For both offence's horses will be tested at the expense of the teamster/representative and prize money will be forfeited to OVHDA.
14. No non-member competitor will not be allowed to pull his horses in another member's name.
15. A draw will be disqualified if:
  - A) horse steps on or over the line or markers while hooked to the boat and in motion
  - B) horses are beaten, lines are swung or foul language is used
  - C) helpers interfere in any way after horse are hitched
  - D) teamster / representative or helpers head the horses while drawing or hitching
  - E) teamster / representative or helpers slap, push or touch the horses with hands, lines or whiffletrees in the ring. No check slaps will be allowed.
16. Any teamster / representative or helper will automatically be ejected from the contest and all winning forfeited if:
  - A) he argues with the Judge
  - B) any abuse such as slashing, kicking or beating of horses takes place while in the holding area. There will be no chasing of horses around the ring. Decisions to be made by the Judge or Committee.
17. All decisions made by the judge are final. All OVHDA judges will be sanctioned by the Board of Directors before judging at OVHDA horse pulls.
18. Detailed explanation of Rule #1 - Drug Testing  
All teams are subject to a drug test at any time with NO DRUGS OR STEROIDS to be allowed. Urine or blood samples only to be taken. Testing to be done at random by a licensed veterinarian or technician. Horses being tested are to be taken to an isolated area when possible or are to be taken directly to the drug testing area and then unharnessed. Horses and teamster / representative to remain until the urine or

blood sample has been collected. A waiting time of 1 ½ hours is compulsory and if a urine or blood sample has not been collected within this limit, horses will be free to go. Teamster / representative or other authorize person to remain with the team at the drug testing area at all times. No team is to be left unattended.

- A) Teamster / representative will forfeit placing and prize money.
  - B) The prize money for the teams tested must be given by the fair board to OVHDA to hold until test results are received. If a team tests positive, the prize money will go to OVHDA to defray the cost of the test.
  - C) When a drug test is done, the fair board should not pay the prize money until the tests have been cleared.
  - D) If there is a run-away or any damages caused by a team, that team will be impounded and drug tested immediately with the owner paying all costs. They will be placed last and will forfeit their prize money and the team will also be suspended from further contests until their drug test results are received.
  - E) Teamster / representative name and horses name to be publicized in our monthly newsletter for a period of 1 year from the date of the test results.
  - F) A letter will be sent to all fair boards advising them of a positive test.
  - G) Any voting member if found guilty will lose voting privileges in the Association for a period of 1 year.
  - H) \*The teamster / representative will pay a fine of \$1000 for 1st offence, \$2000 for 2nd offence and \$4000 for 3rd offence and there will be no suspension of horses or teamster / representative once the fine is paid. Any open offences prior to this change remain. All fines must be paid in cash.
  - I) A person under suspension is prohibited from driving, hitching and/or helping in the ring once the contest has commenced.
  - J) Ottawa Valley Horse Drawing Association Inc. and Central Canadian Horse Pulling Association will honor each other's drug testing penalties if there is a positive test.
19. A teamster / representative can request the help of another teamster to tail the lines at the judge's or any teamster's discretion.

# LIGHT & HEAVY PONY PULL 2023

Lightweight Class – 48 inches and under, Heavy Class – 49-56 inches

## Rules and Regulations for Pony Pull:

1. A person may enter and drive as many teams as he/she likes in each class.
2. A team or horse may draw in one class only.
3. A teamster is allowed two helpers if he so desires.
4. No interference whatsoever by the helpers while horses are drawing or draw disqualified.
5. Teamsters or helpers are not allowed at horse's heads while hitching or drawing.
6. No cursing, swinging lines, beating horses with ends of line while hitched or drawing.
7. Teamsters and helpers are to stay behind whiffletrees while horses are drawing.
8. Teamsters and helpers are not allowed to touch, push, or slap horses with hands.
9. No check slaps allowed.
10. In case of break in harness, time to repair determined by the judge.
11. Two complete draws of 15 feet required. There will be 2 tries to pull the load 15 feet. The horses while pulling, must stay within the course lines or be disqualified from that try only.
12. Any movement under 4 inches will be considered a chuck if the teamster is trying to hold team and this will not be considered a pull.
13. Two passes in front of the boat will constitute one try.
14. Teamster, upon entering the pull area has 2 minutes to hitch and 4 minutes to complete pull.
15. Any teamster or helper arguing with the judge will automatically be ejected from contest.
16. Once team has a draw, that teamster remain teamster for balance of the contest.
17. ALL PULLERS MUST SHOW PROOF OF INSURANCE.
18. All teamsters and helpers must be properly dressed for the occasion.
19. All decisions made by the judge are final.
20. Entries must be pre-registered & membership paid before participating in the pull.
21. Prize money will be FORFEITED if puller not registered before entering the competition.
22. Any team considered dangerous by the judge/pull committee will be disqualified.
23. Once the team enters the pulling area for the first pull, and if they have blinders on, they must remain on, and if they are open, they must stay that way.
