



PET POLICY – WARKWORTH FAIRGROUNDS

No pets of any kind are allowed on the grounds of the Percy Agricultural Society during the Warkworth Fair or any other event designated “pet free” by the Society.

The only exceptions are as follows:

1. As a part of an approved entertainment program while remaining only in the designated areas, meeting applicable health and legal requirements, including the proper insurance as required by the Percy Agricultural Society for all exhibitors and vendors, and remaining under the control of the exhibitor at all times. Upon the conclusion of any animal(s) portion of an entertainment program, such animals shall be returned to their caged area on the Fair Grounds, if it is a permanent part of the entertainment program, or such animals shall be removed from the Fair Grounds by its owner if they are only a participant/competitor in the entertainment program.
2. As service animals or service animals in training, properly restrained and identified by the handler.
3. Vendors are discouraged but allowed to have animal(s) as part of their exhibits where the animal(s) is approved by the Percy Agricultural Society and is a necessary and vital part of the display, if the following conditions are met:
 - a. Animal(s) should always be under control & restricted to booth area that has been purchased by the vendor.
 - b. All necessary health and legal requirements must be met. Animal(s) must be provided with a cool shaded area and fresh water and never left in a parked automobile.
 - c. No one may parade or walk the animal(s) throughout the exhibits, booths or other Fairground areas during operating hours unless the animal(s) has been designated as a service animal.
4. Certain areas or buildings on the grounds may be designated as restricted access areas at specified times, due to heightened safety concerns for exhibitors or participants where show animals could become agitated and pose a risk to people and livestock. (eg; cow palace beef show, horse pull)
5. The Percy Agricultural Society reserves the right to have an animal(s) removed from the premises in the event that the above conditions are not met or the animal(s) is perceived to pose a threat to the general public, fair patrons, exhibitors or livestock.
